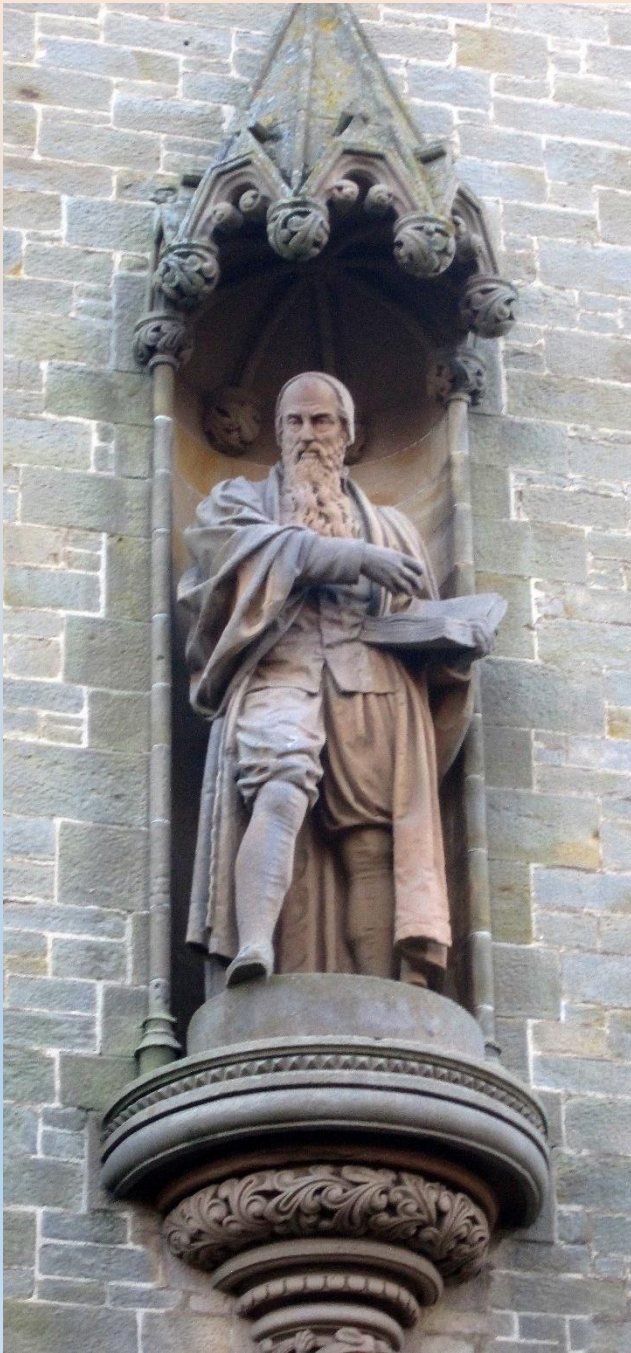

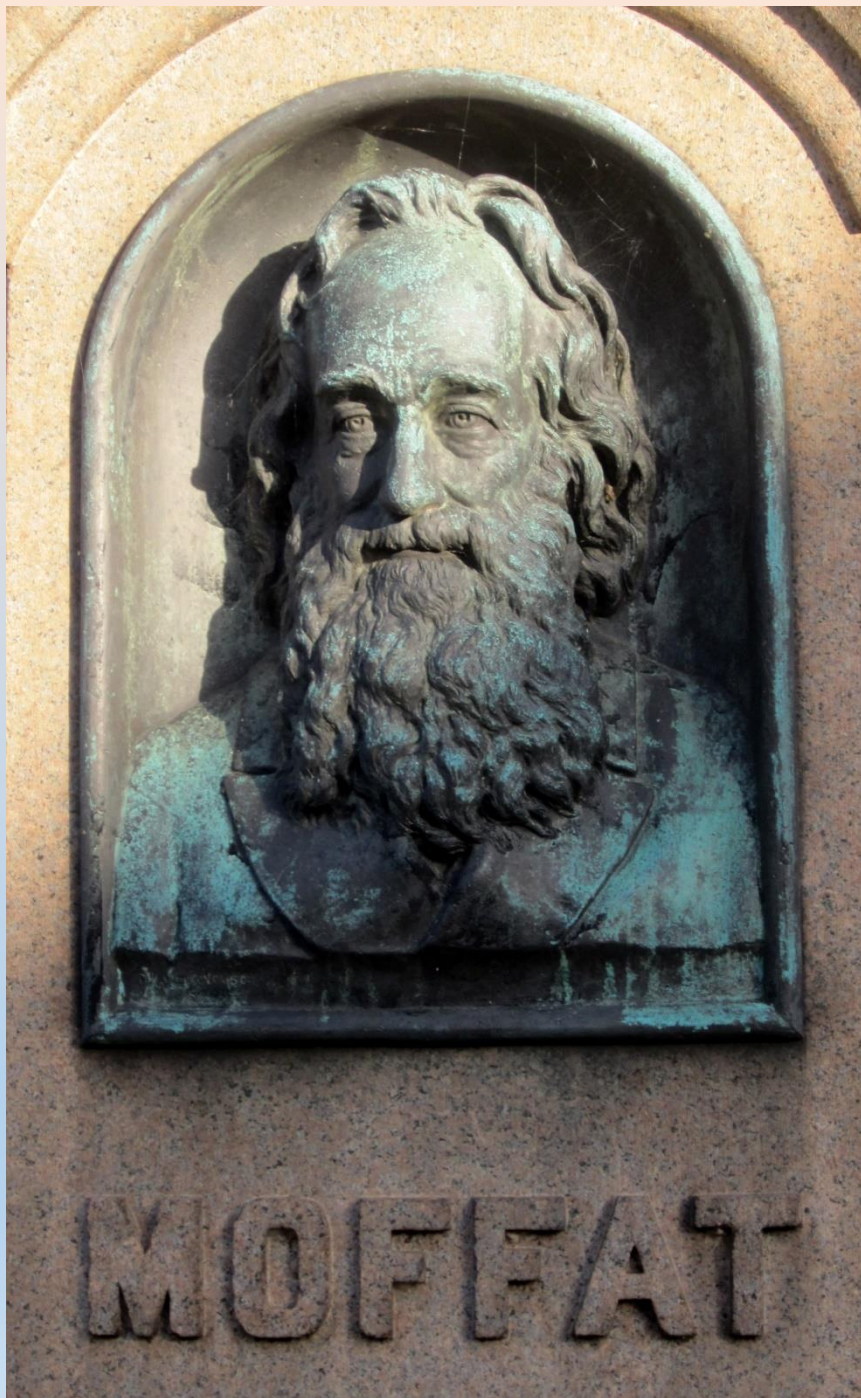
He had two wives :

Tranent

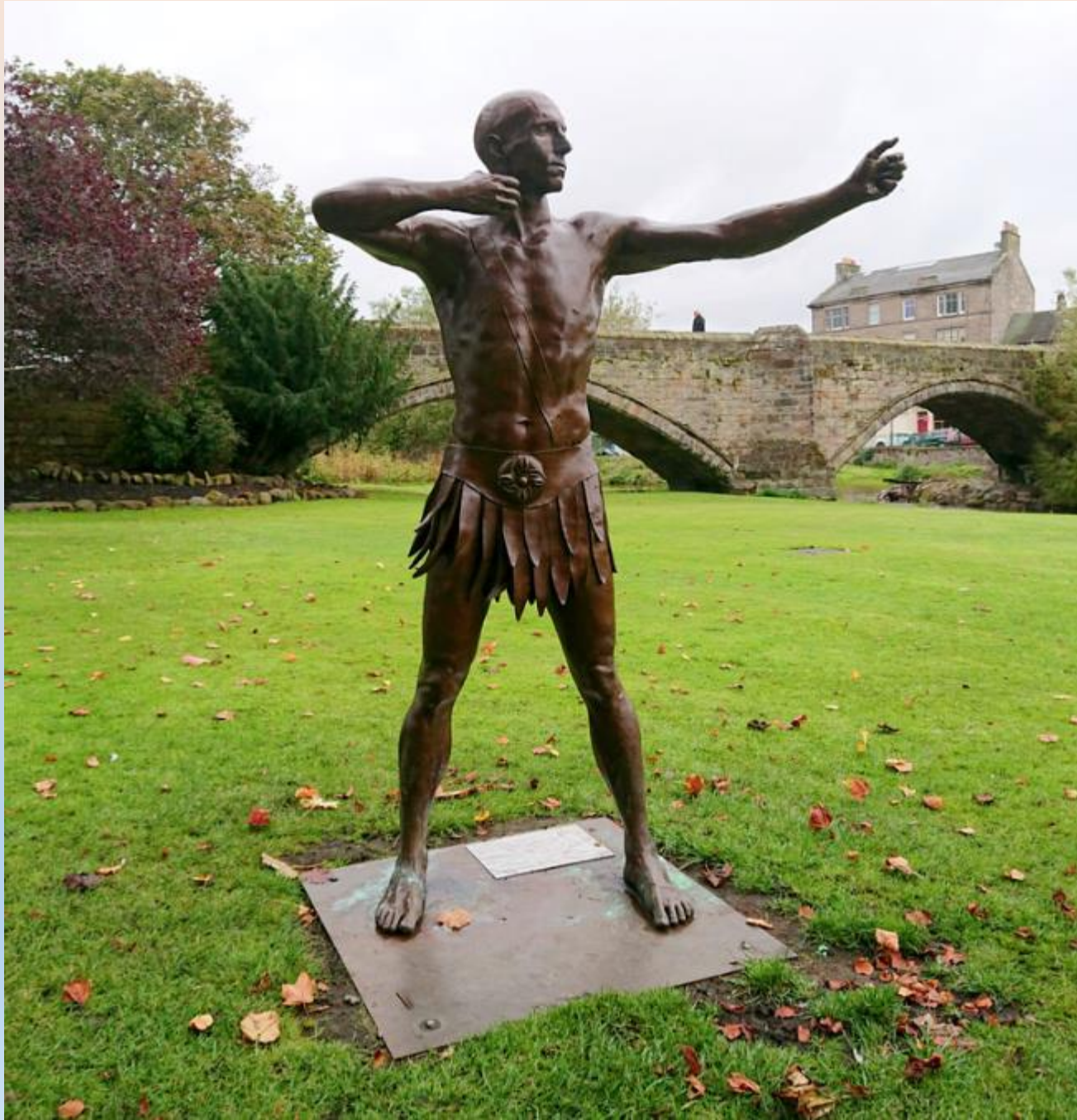
Jackie Crookston was killed in the Tranent Massacre on 29th August 1797. Dragoons slaughtered civilians protesting against conscription.

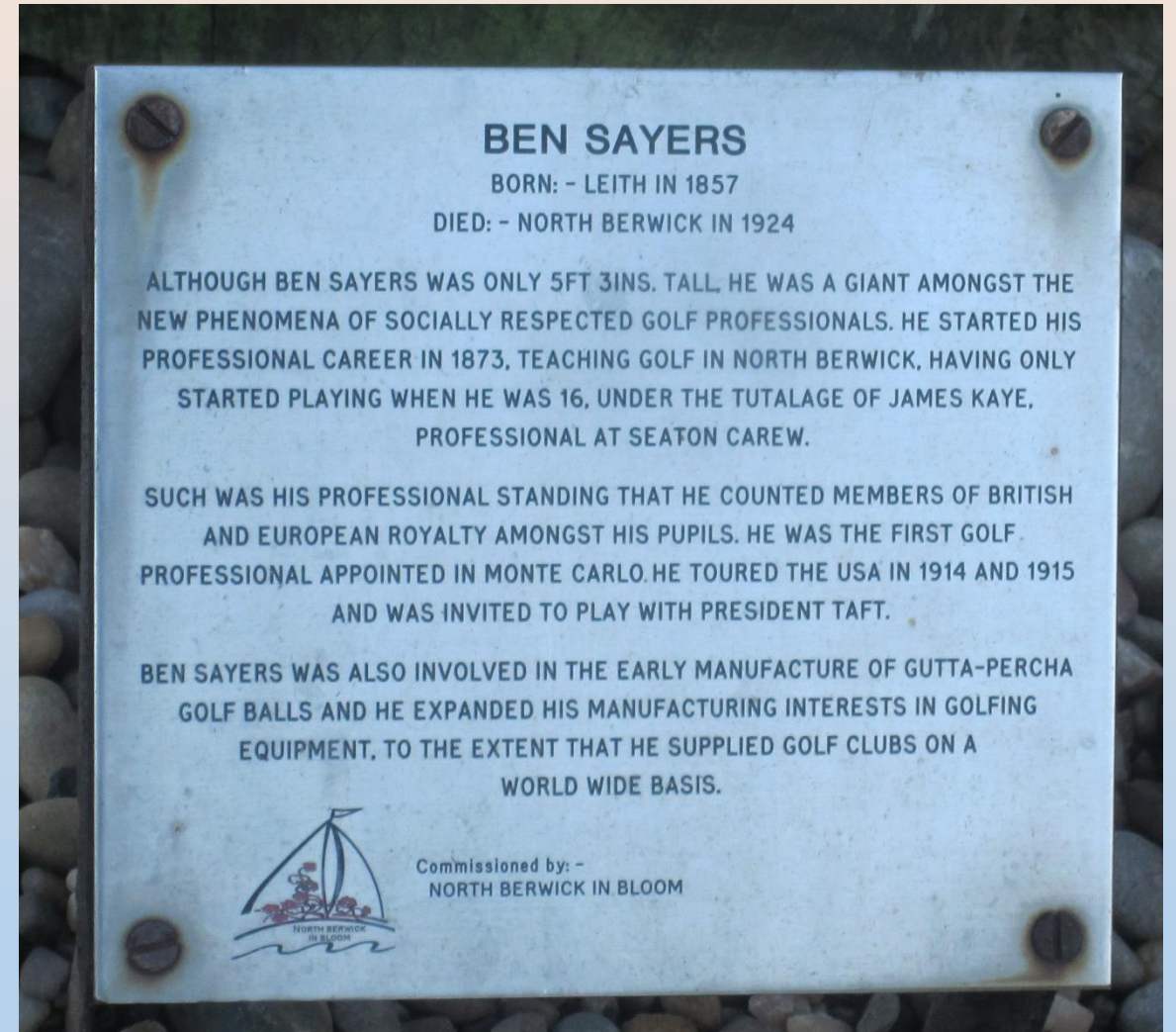

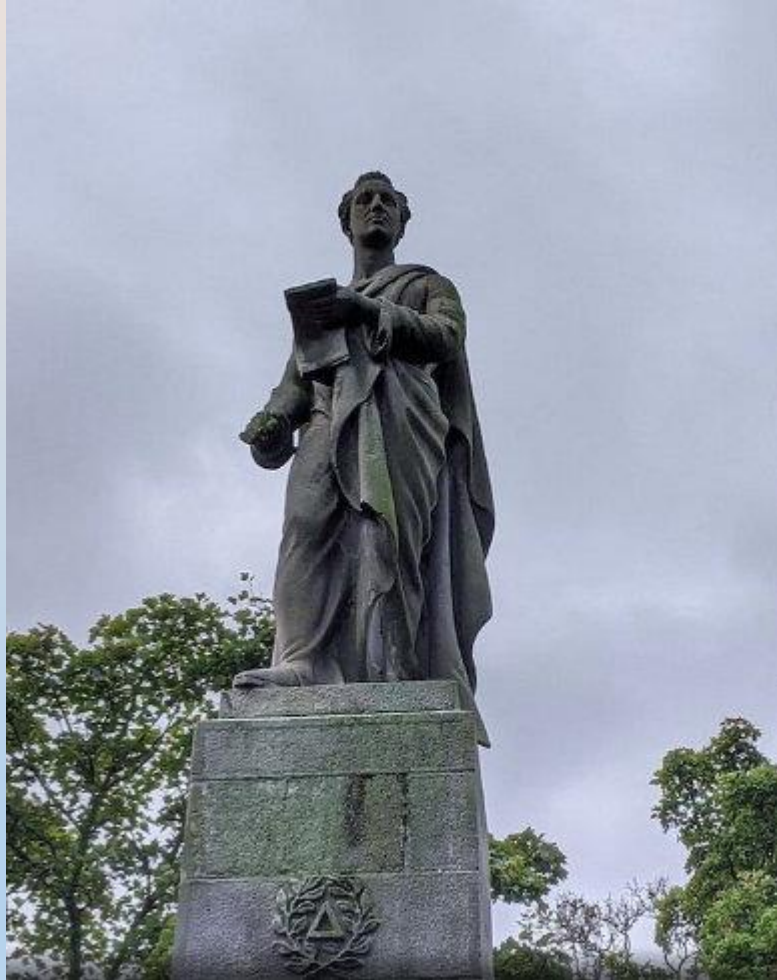
