Compare your answers with this list of people working for the nuns at the Priory of St Mary, Haddington in 1560 and their payment each year. Do you think £1 in 1560 was worth more or less than £1 today? Look at the wages. Which jobs were well paid and which not? Think about why?

Activity 6

The Priory made an allowance, called a 'portion', for each nun. The portion covered food and clothing. The value was £27 38p each year. There were about 20 nuns in 1560. What was the total cost of the portions?

Activity 7

The nuns provided this amount of charity and hospitality in 1560. A boll is worth 70p. What was the total value of charity given by the nuns in 1560?

To old men, widows, poor pilgrims and beggars	£40 in silver and 2 chalders of oatmeal
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To poor people each year	£66 67p
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To feed their horses and provide hospitality for visitors in one year	10 chalders of oats
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A chalder is an old Scots measure equal to 16 bolls. How many bolls of oats did the nuns give in charity and hospitality each year?

Add the total servants' wages and the cost of portions and the amount spent on charity and hospitality.
